he Northern New York Community Foundation, with support from hundreds of generous donors, presents the 2025-2026 Community Spirit Youth Giving Challenge. This program provides an opportunity for seventh-, eighth-, and ninth-grade students attending schools in Jefferson, Lewis, and St. Lawrence counties to explore the concept of community and support a charitable organization they feel best embodies their definition of community and makes it a great place to live, work and play. A total of \$10,000 in community grant awards will be distributed through this initiative, now in its ninth year. Ten students will be selected to each present a \$1,000 grant to a charitable organization of their choice. This initiative is made possible through contributions to the Northern New York Community Foundation's Friends of the Foundation Community Betterment Annual Fund, major corporate support from Community Bank, and a major gift from an anonymous donor.

Important Dates

- The 2025-2026 Youth Giving Challenge begins on Thursday, Dec. 4, 2025.
- Entries must be postmarked, hand-delivered, or submitted online by **Friday**, **Jan. 30**, **2026**, to: **Northern New York Community Foundation**, **131 Washington St.**, **Watertown**, **NY 13601**.
- Announcement of winning submissions will be made no later than mid-February, before students depart for winter break.

Eligibility

- Students in 7th, 8th, and 9th grades attending school in Jefferson, Lewis, and St. Lawrence counties.
- Students who were selected to award grants in previous years are NOT ELIGIBLE to apply.
- Students **must be available** to personally meet with staff at their chosen charitable organization and present their grant. Failure to do so may result in forfeiture of the grant.

Eligible Organizations

• Charitable organizations with current nonprofit 501(c)(3) designation located in **Jefferson**, **Lewis**, **and St. Lawrence** counties are eligible to receive grant awards. An organization may receive **ONLY ONE** Community Spirit Youth Giving Challenge grant per year.

Judging

- A grant review committee will judge all entries, and a total of 10 students will be selected as winners.
- Creativity counts! Students should research local charitable organizations of all sizes, scope, and mission.
- Your definition of "community" should be your own, not a dictionary citation.

Important Considerations

- Return completed entries to: Northern New York Community Foundation, 131 Washington St., Watertown, NY 13601.
- Incomplete or illegible entries will **NOT** be considered.
- Students **MUST** include a current, personal contact phone number and **non-school** email address that they regularly check as a Community Foundation representative will contact students to coordinate visits to their chosen organizations.
- The Community Foundation's Board of Directors will approve all grant awards.

Eligible organizations must have current nonprofit 510(c)(3) status and be located within Jefferson, Lewis or St. Lawrence counties or directly serve residents of those counties. Winning students are expected to personally meet with staff at their chosen organizations and present their grant awards. Students and parents agree that students may be included and featured in any publicity, including social media and media releases regarding the Community Spirit Youth Giving Challenge or their grant may be forfeited.
